In the forefront during the 1st World War, he saved many lives and was wounded three times.

On the 28th of May 1931, he founded the "Association international des Lieux de Genève" or "Geneva Zones" in Paris. In 1935, the French Chamber of Deputies unanimously adopted a resolution inviting the League of Nations "to study the means of establishing in every country, through agreements ratified by the League of Nations, places, localities or zones which would be set apart and free from any military activity or presence in case of armed conflict..."

Surgeon-General, writer, poet, he wrote numerous literary and scientific publications under the pseudonyms G. Espé de Metz and Dr. Laupts.



Under his leadership, on 24 June 1937, the Association des Lieux de Genève moved to Geneva and was renamed "Geneva Zones - The International Association for the Protection of the Civilian Populations and Historic Buildings in Wartime".

The "Geneva Zones" intervened between the adversaries in the Spanish Civil War (1936) and Sino-Japanese conflict (1937) and facilitated the creation of neutralized zones for some categories of non-combatants in Madrid and Bilbao as well as in Shanghai and Nanking.

In 1947, he published a manifesto entitled "La guerre moderne et la protection des civils" (Modern Warfare and the Protection of Civilians) which was presented at the Geneva Diplomatic Conference held in 1949. In it, he recalled the achievements of Surgeon-General Saint Paul and proposed the creation of safety areas, or "Geneva zones".





From the "Association du Lieu de Genève" to the International Civil Defence Organisation

As stated in the Preamble of its 1972 Constitution, the ICDO was created with:

"a view to intensifying and coordinating on a worldwide scale the development and improvement of organisations, means and techniques for preventing and reducing the consequences of natural disasters in peacetime or of the use of weapons in time of conflict".

To this end, the ICDO:

Federates the national services of Member States and represents them at the international level;

Contributes to the creation and strengthening of civil defence and civil protection structures in those countries where they do not exist or are underdevelopped. It has available a network of experts specialised in the management of emergency situations which can be called upon by the Secretary-General of ICDO at the request of a Member State by specific appeal for outside expertise.

Provides technical assistance and consultancy services to national civil defence and civil protection services;

Conceives and develops training programmes for staff of civil defence and civil protection services;

Promotes and facilitates exchanges on civil defence matters between Member States;

Standardises management procedures for emergency situations so as to improve the efficiency of international co-operation in this respect;

Assists its members in their relations with the international community;

Constitutes a forum open to States and related organisations for promoting the exchange of know-how in matters of civil protection/civil defence and disaster management;

Actively participates in the dissemination of international humanitarian law, in particular with respect to civil defence.

The Secretary-General shall be appointed by the Assembly on the nomination of the Council on such terms as the Assembly may determine. The Secretary-General shall be the chief technical and administrative officer of the Organization.

The Secretary-General shall be ex officio Secretary of the Assembly and of the Council, and shall attend ex officio all commissions of the Organization. He may delegate these functions.

The Secretary-General shall prepare and submit annually to the Council the financial statements and budget estimates of the Organization.

The Secretary-General shall appoint the staff of the Secretariat in accordance with staff regulations established by the Assembly.

Mrs. Njoupouo YAP Mariatou is appointed as Secretary-General since 13 october 2020 by the Resolution II of the 24th General Assembly.

ICDO TODAY World Civil Defence Day

World Civil Defence Day, created by decision of the ICDO General Assembly in 1990, is celebrated every year on the 1st of March. It commemorates the entry into force of the ICDO Constitution as an intergovernmental organisation in 1972 and has two main purposes:

- Bringing to the attention of the world public the vital importance of Civil Protection and raising awareness of the preparedness for, and prevention and self-protection measures in the event of accidents or disasters;
- 2. Paying tribute to the efforts, sacrifices and accomplishments of all the national services responsible for the fight against disasters.

The World Days are an occasion for a variety of national events to be held: colloquies, conferences, radio and television debates, open days, disaster prevention and simulation exercises. They also provide an opportunity to take stock of the development of civil protection structures and of the technical means and equipment currently available.






